# March 29, 2025 - Ugadi Celebrations

# March 30, 2025 - Sri Rama Navami Cultural Program







#### **Human Services**

#### Annual Grant-in-Aid (Silver Jubilee Year)

HCCC has been involved in donating during Holiday season like Thanksgiving Dinner, Blankets, Toys etc., to organizations and individuals as part of community service earlier to 1999. Management initiated a new program "**Grant-in-Aid**" to offer financial support then call for application invitations in December 1999 and 1st cash awarded in February 2000 with an 8K budget. Invitation application is open for all qualified registered organizations to apply in December from US and International in the following categories like basic needs such as (Food, Shuttler, Education, Health). The objective of this program is to support as many organizations which include BIG and Smaller as possible within the allocated budgets. As more applications started receiving then management considered increasing the budget and continued this program uninterruptedly. On **March 1st 2025**, 25th Annual Grants-in-Aid was held to award 47 non-profit organizations as total cash funding of \$40K. Few of the awardees are Alameda County Food Bank, Sewa International, Open-heart kitchen, Narika, Trivalley Interfaith Ministries, Asha Jyothi, Rotary Club, Education for all, Livermore Fire Department, Livermore Police, Livermore Schools, Sevalaya, Sai Aashraya Inc and more.

Human Services received few recognition such as Commendation from Alameda County Supervisor Dist 1 David Haubert, Proclamation from Congressman Eric Swalwell (CA-14), California State Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (AD-16), Livermore Mayor by John Marchand and Plaque award from Rotary Club, Sewa International, Asha Jyothi.

In addition, Human Services donated \$10K to the LA California Fire Department with matching donation relief drive efforts.

He has graduated from Sri Venkateswara Veda Pathasala, Tirumala with second class in the Pratishanta Vaikanasa Agama examination after 8 years of study in 2001. He has also passed the Tamilnadu HRNCE Board Vaikana Archaka Exams conducted by the Government of Tamilnadu in Utsava Pratishta Bhagam with first class. He hails from a family of priests going back seven generations in Sri Villiputtur and Madurai. He has worked as a temple priest in Madurai, London and Uganda before he joined us in April 2015. He is a specialist in Alankaras. He has been involved in the Pratishtas, Brahmotsavams, Pavithrotsavams for the last 22 years. He speaks Tamil, Telugu, English, Hindi.



#### PDT HARE KRISHNA MAHAPATRA

**PDT. Harekrishna Mahapatra** is a Shukla Yajurveda Priest of Smarth and Sakta Agama. He hails from Balasore, Orissa. He has worked as a Veda Parayan Pandit for 5 years priest before becoming a teacher in Shukla Yajurved in Dudeshwarnath Vedh Vidya Peeth for 8 years. He began his career as a priest in Nageshwara Swamy Devalayam in Chinakallepalle, Krishna District where he served for 9 years.
